

# Concept Note 38th STOP TB Partnership Board Meeting Abuja, Nigeria, 12-14 December 2024 Session 2: Financing the Response to End TB by 2030

Date and time: 13 December, 9-11am

# **BACKGROUND**

The 2023 UNHLM political declaration has ambitious targets for mobilizing increased funding for TB. WHO in its Global TB Report reported a decrease in funding for TB in 2023 at the global level. A few high burden countries have done well to increase funding for TB but many others are finding it challenging. Despite lot of advocacy with Global Fund Board the funding allocation to TB from Global Fund may not change much. TB deaths have not reduced significantly (or comparably to HIV and malaria) since 2005. It is time to search for more sources of funding beyond Global Fund.

## **SCOPE AND PURPOSE**

The session will highlight current and possible sources of funding, especially sources other than Global Fund, with concrete examples from countries and partners.

## **EXPECTED OUTCOME**

Board discussions will inspire stakeholders from high TB burden countries to consider all sources of funding for TB response – domestic and external and will provide steer to the Secretariat for supporting countries in their efforts .

## **DETAILS OF SESSION**

After a brief "setting the scene", a panel of ten speakers will be invited to present one example of the potential sources of funding and explaining how/ what they did to increase funding for TB in their country.
